

Personal Equipment List

Required

- Official Scout uniform(s) for your current Scouting position (Note: A complete uniform includes the official shirt, pants, shorts (with long Scout socks), skirt, or culottes, socks, and belt. A neckerchief and slide will be provided.)
- Scout activity uniform(s), aka Class B uniform (Note: An activity uniform includes a shirt with a BSA insignia of some sort, official pants, shorts (with long Scout socks), skirt, or culottes, socks, and belt.)
- Shoes or boots
- Windbreaker or jacket
- Rain gear (poncho or rain suit)
- Underwear
- Tent with rain fly
- Ground pad, air mattress, or cot
- Sleeping bag
- Flashlight with spare batteries and bulb
- Pocketknife or multiple tool-type knife (no fixed-blade knives)
- Medication in labeled containers
- Toiletries
- Towels and washcloths
- Pens, pencils, pocket notebook
- Compass
- Canteen or water bottle
- Mess Kit (for cooking & eating)
- Backpacking stove
- Handbook for your Scouting program
- Camp chair
- Backpack for carrying your gear to and from the site of the Outdoor Experience

Suggested

- Pillow
- Change of shoes
- Moccasins/camp slippers
- Shower footwear
- Sunglasses
- Religious book(s)
- Books of camp songs,
- Camera and film or digital camera
- Sunscreen
- Chapstick
- Insect repellent
- Handkerchief
- Work clothes for the Conservation project. Old pants (can be jeans), old shirt, leather gloves, etc.
- Matches or lighter
- Lantern (if you can backpack it)
